Hour 1

Physical Science-Cindy 1 credit

This Christian physical science course introduces students to chemistry and physics. In the chemistry portion of the class, students learn what matter is made of and how it interacts in chemical reactions, nuclear changes, solutions, and acids and bases. In the physics part of the class, students learn about how matter and energy move and why they move; they study the many forms of energy and how energy moves throughout the world. This high school science class is focused on helping students understand the world that God created and is based on a biblical worldview.

Psychology-Kayla 1 credit

In Introduction to Psychology, students will cover the history of modern psychology. We will dive into topics, such as behavior, memory, and intelligence and how they shape the foundations of

human life. We will discuss the methodology of many psychology greats, such as Piaget, Skinner, and Gestalt, among others. Students will examine the various subsets of psychology and how they are best applied to people and their unique needs and backgrounds. Students will utilize various forms of in class learning, whether by readings, PowerPoints, and other in class activities. Videos/clips related to curriculum and famous scientific experiments may be viewed in class, as well as discussing how the standards of care have changed for practitioners, due to ethical concerns in the past.

Hour 2

***Apologetics and Debate-Cindy ½ or 1 credit**

The apologetics part of this class covers important details that can strengthen student's confidence in the Bible's inerrant nature, and how the Bible proves itself, as well as insights students need to strengthen their faith and defend God's Word. This class will also provide an introduction to high school level debate. This will include in class practice activities and debates on various topics, some that have been used by Christian high school debate leagues, some apologetics related, and some just for fun. This class will include student research and discussion of topics from various media sources both current and historical. Students will be looking for evidence to prove their points as well as fallacies in the arguments of others, while learning to analyze current social, commercial, and political issues from a Biblical worldview. One of our class goals is to learn how you can attempt to consistently attack positions and beliefs rather than the people you are debating.

***Writing and Literature-Kayla ½ or 1 credit**

This year-long literature class invites students to read and deeply engage with five carefully selected novels spanning a range of genres, time periods, and cultural perspectives. Through reading, lively discussion, and critical analysis, students will explore each novel's themes, characters, and literary techniques. Assignments will include, but are not limited to, reflective journaling and analytical writings to support a deeper understanding of each work.

Performing Arts-Selena ½ credit Fall only

This class will focus on show choir, where we'll explore a variety of songs and bring them to life with choreography. We'll also experiment with creating music using a variety of instruments, and finally performing at the Christmas Show.

Art-Selena ½ credit Spring only

*Come explore the world of painting! In this class, we'll learn how to use brushes, mix colors, and create art. We'll try different techniques and styles as you discover what kind of artist you are.

Hour 3

***Drama-Selena ½ or 1 credit**

Semester 1:

We'll dive into the art of set creation, explore the world of props, and get creative with costumes, hair, and makeup. You'll also learn how to help a production run smoothly—becoming a true behind-the-scenes **ninja** 🥷!

Semester 2:

We'll start by selecting a script and learning how to **slate**—just like the pros do when auditioning for a role. Then we'll jump into rehearsals, and by the end of the semester, we'll **perform for the school!**

But this isn't just about acting—you'll also be hands-on with **costumes, hair, makeup, set design**, and more.

***3D Art-Kayla ½ or 1 credit**

In this art class students will explore multiple 3D mediums, such as, batik and textile art, polymer clay, papier mache, puppetry, cardboard sculpture, wire work

Health-Cindy ½ credit Fall only

In this Christian high school health class, students learn how to protect their health through accurate knowledge of the human body, health, safety, and disease prevention from a biblical worldview. Through the framework of a biblical worldview, students are challenged to be good stewards of the bodies God gave them, while also supporting healthy stewardship of the community and the environment. Students will be encouraged to make ethical decisions for physical, mental, and spiritual health from a Biblical worldview to support a well-rounded lifestyle.

Economics-Cindy ½ credit Spring only

This high school economics class introduces fundamental economic principles, including free-market ideals, supply and demand, and productivity. Topics from household purchases to the stock market, including banking, inflation, and unemployment are also covered with a biblical perspective. To help prepare students to understand and manage personal, household, and government finances from a biblical worldview, practical information about stewardship, budgeting, banking, debt, interest, credit management, saving, and planning are also covered. Students will also learn about issues related to national economic systems and policies.
