CHEMISTRY

Full Year

Prerequisite: Pre-Algebra

This high school chemistry course aims to provide students with a working understanding of chemistry while also preparing them for college-level studies and the ACT in a friendly homeschool class environment. Students will get an in-depth introduction to the methods and concepts of general chemistry, as well as many in class chemistry lab experiments that will help them learn and understand the concepts covered. For this chemistry class, students will have examples of typical homework and test questions, along with explained answers, available to study in their textbooks, and tests will be assigned as homework. Additionally, educational videos will often be posted along with student assignments to support understanding for most of the concepts we are learning.



RESEARCH WRITING

Semester

Research Writing will teach students the essential skills needed to write a formal research paper with clarity, structure, and academic integrity. Students will learn how to thoughtfully select and narrow a topic, develop a focused research question, and gather credible sources through guided research and organized note-taking. Instruction will include crafting a strong thesis statement, creating a structured outline, and drafting well-developed body paragraphs with proper footnoting. By the end of the course, students will complete a polished final research paper demonstrating critical thinking, academic writing skills, and correct documentation practices



PERSONAL FINANCE

Full Year

Foundations in Personal Finance equips students with essential money management skills needed for real life. Using Dave Ramsey's proven principles, this course teaches students how to budget, save, manage spending, understand credit and debt, build wealth, and make wise financial decisions. Students will use a combination of video, internet, and textbook materials to learn life long practices to help encourage financial success as they enter adulthood.



HOME EC

Semester

Home Economics is a hands-on cooking and baking class designed to build confidence and creativity in the kitchen. Students will learn essential cooking techniques, baking fundamentals, and kitchen safety while preparing a variety of appetizers, main dishes, side dishes and desserts. We will work in teams to prepare two different dishes every class period, which will then be shared among the whole class to sample. We will adhere to our school policy of being a nut free kitchen, but this class would not be suitable for someone with other food allergies/sensitivities.. This class is limited to a maximum of 10 students



STEM: BOTANY

Semester

This class teaches key plant science topics – such as plant anatomy, seed germination, photosynthesis, reproduction, pollination, and classification – using simple, hands-on activities, diagrams, vocabulary work, research projects and observation exercises.



SPEECH

CHOICE: Semester or Full Year

This course will encourage students to feel confident communicating publicly and help them develop proficiency in giving speeches and performances in a friendly environment. Students will learn about and practice the mechanics of effective communication as well as other technical aspects of speech, and will have regularly assigned activities and speeches. In this class, we will cover all sorts of oral communication, such as conversations, interviews, group discussions, monologues, storytelling, oral interpretations, extemporaneous speaking, parliamentary procedure, and other forms of public communication. Note: if a student takes both semesters, they will be required to perform different speeches each semester.



Choir

Semester

This class will focus on preparing music for our Christmas performance. Students will prepare a classical and a contemporary piece to share with our families. Topics covered will be sight singing, harmonizing, vocal technique, and performance



US HISTORY

Full Year


This history class covers major events of US history from the pre-Columbian period to the present through the lens of God's providence and power. We will be using a Christian textbook curriculum, and students will be encouraged to practice analytical thinking and to evaluate people, events, and movements in history from a biblical worldview. Classes will include videos, activities, and discussions, and homework will include videos, assignments, and tests.



CAREER EXPLORATION

Semester

Career Exploration is designed to help students discover their interests, strengths, and possible career paths. Students will learn how education, skills, and personal values connect to different jobs, and gain practical tools such as goal setting, resume basics, and career planning. Career Exploration provides students with an opportunity to examine what their God-given strengths, talents, and interests are and how they can translate into finding a career path that is fulfilling to how they are wired. We will have a variety of speakers from various trades and professions to learn about opportunities in different post- high school tracks.




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CREATIVE WRITING

Semester

This course helps students develop their unique voice and imagination through a variety of writing styles. Students will explore fiction, nonfiction, and personal writing while learning to use descriptive language, practice “showing not telling,” and build strong story structure—including beginning, middle, end, rising action, and climax. Through guided practice and revision, students will grow in both creativity and storytelling skill.



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STEM: ZOOLOGY

Semester

This course introduces students to the study of animals and the diversity of life within the animal kingdom. Students will explore animal classification, anatomy, habitats, behavior, and ecosystems while learning how different species interact with their environments. Through hands-on activities, observation, and research, students will gain a deeper understanding of animal life and the principles of biology that govern it.



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Fine Arts Appreciation Semester

This class will combine all of the fine arts: music, drama, and visual art. Students will explore history and elements of each expression and discuss how they inform modern culture.



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Mixed Media Art

Semester

Mixed Media Art will provide students an opportunity to explore various art forms in both a 2D and 3D format. We will be utilizing various forms of painting, collage, and sculpture with materials that can range from recycled, found, or repurposed materials.
